


### Dear Friends and Prayer Partners

The university campus ministry in semester one has concluded with mixed feelings. The first quarter of the year saw the completion of Beyond Brisbane Project 2021; the revitalization of student leadership (Movement Multiplier MM); the harmonization of campus-based (Catalyst) & home-based (House of Peace) fellowship, whereas the second quarter felt a bit heavy-hearted because the fear of COVID was lurking in our city. Brisbane was imposed with two lockdowns in April and June respectively. While most of our students are safe and sound here, some individuals have their family members succumbed to the virus in their homes overseas. Therefore, Ken and Florence want to begin this newsletter with a prayer of compassion: "Praise the Lord, my soul; all my inmost being, praise His holy name. ### The LORD who Heals



God is known by many names in the Bible. Each name reveals a certain aspect of His character. Yahweh-Rophe is one such name which means the LORD who heals in the Hebrew text (Exodus 15:26b). Rophe is used more than sixty times throughout the Old Testament to

assure healing, cure and restoration. It is our wish that we are blessedly assured by Jesus: "When Jesus came down from the mountainside, large crowds followed him. A man with leprosy came and knelt before him and said, 'Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean.' Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. 'I am willing,' he said. 'Be clean!' Immediately he was cleansed of his leprosy." (Matthew 8:1-3). Therefore, the theme of this newsletter is 'The LORD who Heals'.

### Post-Easter Outreach Accomplished

The 3-day outreach planned at Easter in UQ was rescheduled to 13-15 April due to a COVID lockdown in Brisbane. #### From Della

"Isaiah 49:15 comes to my mind when I recall UQ's Market Day during Semester 1 of 2021. I perchance sat across a lady who was a Power to Change ministry worker talking the message of Christ and His salvation. To date, I don't know why I decided to share with this lady my testimony of a miracle of God's might witnessed within my family, along with it, my burden and questions as a Christian. I was invited to my first Catalyst fellowship where I was introduced to Florence. One question that grounded me was "Do I think I will go to heaven?" I immediately answered "No" and shared my feelings why. I am a sinner and an alcoholic. Despite being a Christian, my heart was filled with anger and hurt. Florence disciplined me and we met every week from then on and explore the word of the Lord. These meetings revitalized my waning faith that was becoming riddled with doubts. I learnt to forgive and seek the Lord's forgiveness and acceptance. I began to share scriptures from our sessions to my friends, both Christians and non-Christians. I am in a better place now than I was prior to meeting this Power to Change lady. This meeting, I have come to realize, was not a coincidental encounter but the Lord's miracles working. He did not forsake me, he has not forgotten me."

"I am grateful to God for bringing Florence to me. In the past year, I have been under a lot of physical and mental stress. The online study of school and work had often left me on the verge of emotional breakdown. However, I am grateful for the pressures of the past year that have pushed me to God for help. Especially in my conversations with Florence and Bible study, through the experience of Ruth and Daniel, I learned about God's work on people and how to deal with difficulties as a Christian. Although we could not communicate face to face, I could see the message that God conveyed to me through Florence every time. In addition, I also want to thank Florence for her prayer for my study, work and spiritual life, which saved me from losing confidence when I was at a low point. Mona."
