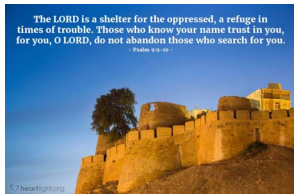
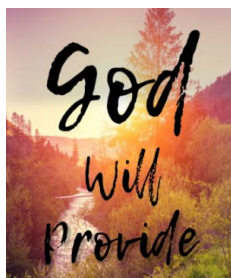


Dear Friends and Prayer Partners

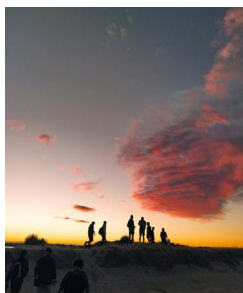
The LORD will Provide
